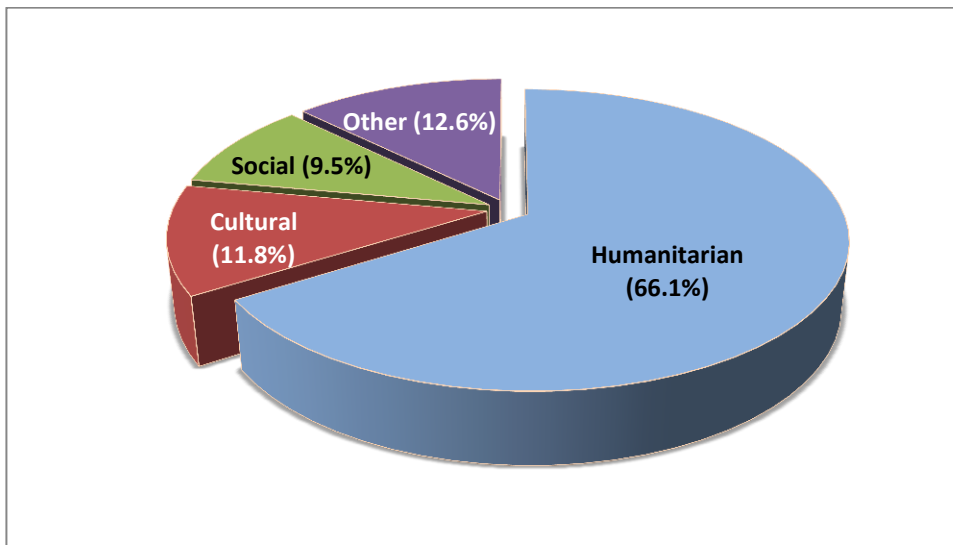




Report on Small Grants and IT Donations (2012)

The EIB Institute aims at promoting local philanthropy by channeling support, mainly through grants in support of eligible initiatives or donations of IT equipment that is no longer used by the EIB Group, to non-profit organisations, local community centres or schools.

In 2012, the Institute approved **20** grants, equating to a total of around **EUR 47 500**, supporting initiatives in different categories with the following breakdown:



The table below provides further details on total requests and shows that the total grant budget of EUR 75 000 for the year was spent to a level of 63%.

Grant award criteria
<p>Only initiatives submitted by not-for-profit organisations that can prove that they are well managed are eligible for financial assistance. Purely national initiatives are also excluded.</p> <p>To be eligible, initiatives also have to meet at least one of the three following criteria:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">a - initiatives submitted by humanitarian organisations operating internationally;b - initiatives of a cultural or social nature with a European character;c - initiatives contributing to European integration and fulfilling at least one of the two following conditions:<ul style="list-style-type: none">1) the objectives are directly related to the Bank's activities;2) the objectives present a direct interest to the Bank.

Award procedures

- 1) the Bank does not make contractual undertakings and does not become a member of organisations, save where this is considered to be in its interest;
- 2) in order to avoid grants being renewed indefinitely, from 1996 onwards grants to the same organisation have been limited to a maximum duration of three years;
- 3) applications are examined in a collegial way by the Social Committee.
