## Grants

As a key pillar of the EIB Group’s community and citizenship engagement, the EIB Institute provides grants for disaster relief. The EIB Institute also uses grants to support philanthropic social or sporting events with relevant participation by EIB Group staff.

## IT donations

The EIB Institute also aims to promote local philanthropy by channelling support through donations of IT equipment no longer used by the EIB Group to not-for-profit organisations, local community centres or schools registered in an EU Member State.

In 2019, the Institute donated 1 221 desktops, laptops, printers and other IT equipment to 91 schools and not-for-profit organisations (see pages 4 to 7 for details):

## 1 - Beneficiaries of grants for humanitarian catastrophes in 2019

### Cyclone IDAI in southern Africa

This donation helped nine beneficiary organisations to provide emergency relief aid, helping the victims of the cyclone that hit in March 2019 with devastating consequences, in particular in Mozambique, but also heavily affecting Malawi and Zimbabwe.

### Staff philanthropic events

#### **SPICY 3 Initiative**

The EIB Institute provided a grant of **EUR 4 000** to the “SPICY 3” Initiative, a solidarity triathlon to collect donations to support various actions in Burkina Faso, notably the construction of a medical and social centre to help children suffering from serious diseases such as Noma, a gangrene of the face.

The intermediary beneficiary was Hymne aux Enfants Luxembourg asbl, which in turn channelled the grant to Fondation L’hymne aux enfants (Burkina Faso).

Three teams including five EIB staff members were formed to participate in the triathlon and 82 EIB staff members donated to this cause, on top of the Institute’s specific donation.

#### **“Relais pour la Vie” Initiative**

The EIB Institute provided a grant of **EUR 4 000** to the “Relais pour la Vie” Initiative, a race against cancer, where teams help fundraise to support cancer prevention, research, as well as those impacted by the disease.

The beneficiary was Fondation luxembourgeoise contre le cancer.

The EIB participated with two master teams running with the colours of the EIB and members of the teams and other EIB staff who support this cause contributed with donations, complemented by the Institute’s dedicated donation.

## **2 - Beneficiaries of decommissioned IT equipment in 2019**

In total, 144 desktop PCs and 1 065 laptops – corresponding to a total of 85 approved requests (plus six direct donations from EIB external offices) – were donated. Beneficiaries were located in 15 countries: Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, China, the Czech Republic, France, Germany, Greece, Kenya, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Morocco, Portugal, Romania and Slovakia.

(\*) Contrary to the general rule that stipulates that the beneficiary has to be registered in an EU Member State, the beneficiaries of IT equipment from external offices can be local not-for-profit organisations.

In 2017, the Institute renewed its partnership with Close the Gap –which takes used IT equipment to African schools, helping young people in the countries concerned to improve their educational and economic prospects – for a period of three years. The EIB has donated more than 4 000 pieces of IT equipment to the organisation since 2014, including 1 000 items in 2019.
