

EIB Institute Grants and IT Donations Report (2022)

Grants

As a key pillar of the EIB Group’s community and citizenship engagement, the EIB Institute provides grants in response to humanitarian catastrophes and to support philanthropic social or sports events with relevant participation by EIB Group staff.

We made the following donations related to humanitarian catastrophes (details on pages 2 to 4):

Due to the ongoing pandemic, no grants were allocated to support the participation of EIB staff in social or sports events in 2022.

IT donations

The EIB Institute also aims to promote local philanthropy by channelling support through donations of IT equipment no longer used by the EIB Group to not-for-profit organisations, local community centres and schools registered in an EU Member State.

In 2022, the Institute donated **910** desktops, laptops, and other IT equipment to **49** schools and not-for-profit organisations (see pages 5 and 6 for details):

1. Beneficiaries of grants for humanitarian catastrophes in 2022

1.1 Tonga volcano eruption

€150 000 was donated to Care Luxembourg a.s.b.l. to safely and sustainably relocate the Kanokupolu community. The funds are being used to build the provision of water supply at the new location for the community.

1.2 Ukraine war

€100 000 was donated to Fondation Caritas Luxembourg to help people who were displaced to Moldova.

€700 000 was donated to the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies (IFRC) to support vulnerable people, including unaccompanied minors, single women with children, elderly people, and people with disabilities, both in Ukraine as well as in neighbouring countries.

€195 000 was donated to Johanniter-Unfall-Hilfe e.V. for emergency humanitarian support within Ukraine, such as the delivery of food, medicine and water, and for refugees arriving at the Hungarian border (accommodation, medical support and direction).

€400 000 was donated to Malteser International for basic food and health needs in Ukraine and to refugees in neighbouring countries.

€200 000 was donated to Save the Children to support children, including the most vulnerable, such as unaccompanied minors, children with disabilities, and children without families.

€700 000 was donated to UNICEF Luxembourg to ensure access to safe water for impacted families and access to humanitarian supplies, provide psychosocial care and establish 'Blue Dot' child-friendly spaces along key travel corridors in six neighbouring countries to provide critical support to children and families on the move.

€205 000 was donated to Médecins du Monde to provide healthcare for people fleeing the war via the Slovakian and Hungarian borders, with particular emphasis on vulnerable groups, such as survivors of sexual violence, people with disabilities, minorities, stateless persons, pregnant/breastfeeding women, children and elderly people.

€44 920 was donated to All for Victory to purchase and transport 6 800 tactical food kits to people in Ukraine.

€50 000 was donated to Starkmacher e.V. for a digital educational project created for Ukrainian refugee teenagers (called "TUMO for Ukrainian Refugee Kids"), employing Ukrainian refugee teachers (providing them with an income), enabling some 1 500 Ukrainian refugee teenagers across Europe to access the platform.

€800 000 was donated to the Olena Zelenska Foundation to support family-type orphanages in six regions in Ukraine, to help cope with the harsh winter and satisfy other basic needs, reaching around 2 000 orphan children.

€200 000 was donated to LUkraine a.s.b.l. to purchase ambulances, fire trucks, generators and/or other essential items for people in Ukraine.

1.3 **Indonesia earthquake**

€250 000 was donated to Save the Children Spain to re-establish access to learning for 4 500 students and 300 teachers whose school buildings and classrooms were severely damaged.

1.4 **Pakistan floods**

€50 000 was donated to Care Luxembourg to provide hygiene kits, temporary shelters and non-food item kits to about 280 vulnerable households in the Sindh province.

€50 000 was donated to Caritas Luxembourg for the construction of permanent, disaster-resilient houses consisting of one room and one toilet for 35 vulnerable families, as well as 70 toilets in the Punjab province (with a matching contribution from Caritas Austria).

€100 000 was donated to Red Cross Luxembourg to provide emergency relief kits to cover basic needs (tents, tarpaulins, blankets, mosquito nets, kitchen sets and hygiene kits) over four months for 475 vulnerable households in the Sindh province.

€50 000 was donated to UNICEF to provide 1 100 boxes of RUTF (ready-to-use therapeutic food) to treat around 800 children suffering from severe acute malnutrition.

2. Beneficiaries of decommissioned IT equipment in 2022

In total, 151 desktop PCs and 759 laptops were donated, corresponding to a total of 57 approved requests. The beneficiaries were located across 11 countries: Belgium, Bulgaria, Czech Republic, France, Greece, Hungary, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Portugal, Romania and Slovakia.
